

Dress Code

Clothing should be appropriate for a work setting - school is a work site for staff and students, it is not the beach. The following apply:

- clothing/jewelry should be free of pictures/words or logos that are violent, sexist, racist, include foul language, references to drugs/alcohol/smoking, etc. **including clothing with logos that advertise alcohol, cigarettes, drugs etc.**
- no midriffs/under-wear should show between your shirt and your waistband
- shirts cannot have open backs or be too low in the front (no cleavage)
- no tank tops/muscle shirts or dresses with a tank top style (excluding during PE or sporting events)
- shorts/skirts/dresses should be of an appropriate length.

Consequences include:

- being asked to change/cover up immediately
- removal from class until such time as appropriate clothing can be found
- repeat violations or failure to comply with requests are issues of defiance and may result in detentions, in-school suspensions, out of school suspensions and involvement of parents.

Dances

School dances are held to encourage positive social interactions and are open to all students in good standing at PCSS. The following apply:

- all dance tickets must be purchased prior to dance night - no tickets will be sold at the door
- all guests (non-PCSS students) must be approved by the school administration in advance
- guests are not necessarily permitted at all dances
- when guests are permitted to attend they must post a \$50 cash bond which is forfeited if s/he is asked to leave the dance for alcohol, drug or behavioral reasons - further, the student inviting the guest may be subject to a school suspension
- students must be in all classes the day of the dance
- doors close 1 hour after the dance starts - students who will arrive late must have signed the "late list", indicating the reason s/he would be late and have spoken to administration prior to the night of the dance
- students will not be permitted to re-enter the dance after leaving
- students (or guests) who appear to be under the influence of alcohol or drugs will not be admitted; students who are discovered to be under the influence after admittance will be detained in the office area until either their parents or the RCMP can take them home
- as per School Board Policy, students in possession of, or under the influence of alcohol or drugs are immediately and indefinitely suspended from all classes and school activities at PCSS.
